### Who is Entering Your Constituency?

#### A Call for Voter Vigilance

#### For Immediate Release

*4<sup>th</sup> June 2026*

Persatuan Bertindak Pilihan Raya Bebas dan Saksama (“**Tindak**”) examined the latest [\*DAFTAR PEMILIH TAMBAHAN P. 151 SIMPANG RENGAM BULAN APRIL TAHUN 2026\*](#) (P. 151 Simpang Renggam Supplementary Electoral Roll for April 2026) (“**the Electoral Roll**”) and revealed an irregularity possibly concerning the registration of Johor Menteri Besar, Dato’ Onn Hafiz Ghazi. We were alerted by one of our political party acquaintances on this suspicious movement and proceeded with the investigation.

#### **1. Details of the voter transfer record in dispute**

On page 85 of the Electoral Roll, there is a **voter transfer record appears under the name “ONN HAFIZ BIN GHAZI” with the date of birth on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 1978**. The date of birth bears a striking resemblance to the profile of Johor Menteri Besar, whose widely documented birth date falls on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 1979.

Furthermore, the registered address linked to this entry is stated as “**NO 105 BWH**”. When we checked this address with list of Election Commission’s localities, Daerah Mengundi Boundaries, Google Maps and Telekom Malaysia [SmartMap](#), it showed a potential location that correspond to the Simpang Renggam hotel and associated commercial lots underneath the hotel. We assume the abbreviation ‘BWH’ refers to Bawah (Lower).

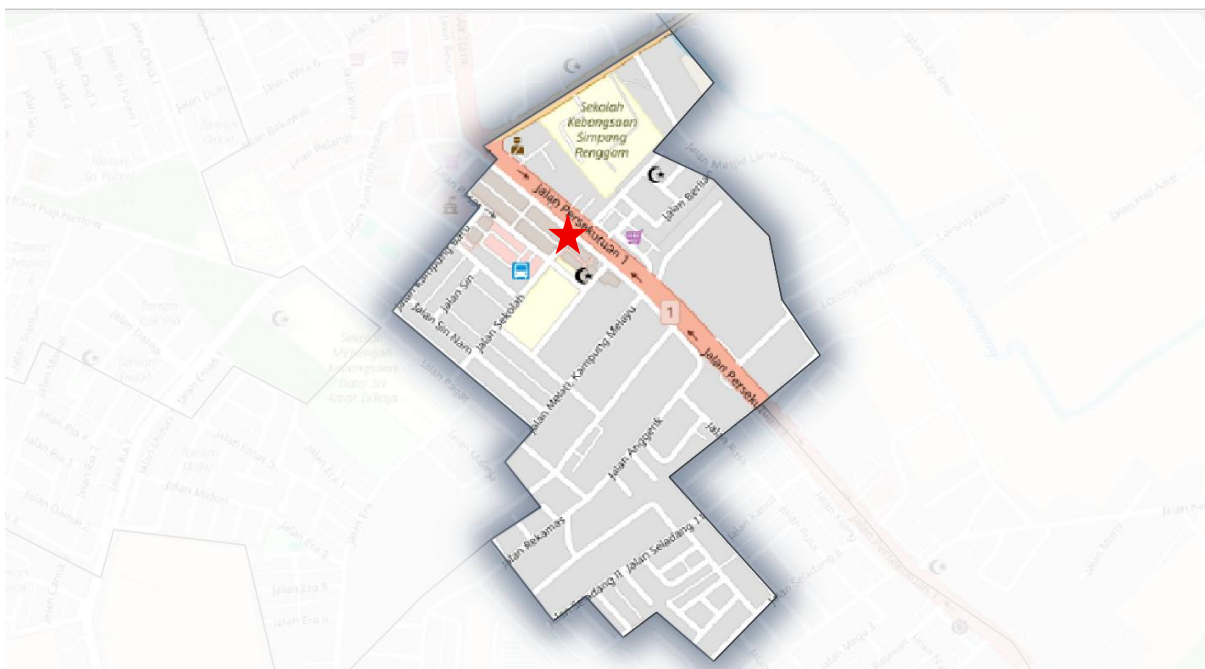


Figure 2: Tindak Map of Bandar Simpang Renggam Timor Daerah Mengundi dan Red Star showing location of 105 BWH

This address raises a question whether the said address is residential or commercial.

## 2. Can the commercial shop lot shown above be considered as a residence?

Under the Elections (Registration of Electors) Regulations 2002, a voter's address on the electoral roll is tied to the details provided in Form A, which requires the voter to provide the address as in MyKad. Since the Electoral Roll lists the Machap State Constituency Service Centre as the voter's address, it logically follows that this commercial shop lot address must be printed on the voter's MyKad.

Nevertheless, this raises a statutory conflict. Regulation 15(1) of the National Registration Regulations 1990 stipulates that any citizen changing their **place of residence** (and not place of employment) must apply for a replacement MyKad. In light of this discrepancy, Tindak poses two (2) questions for the National Registration Department (JPN):

1. Can a commercial shop lot legally qualify as a valid "place of residence" under the regulations, and
2. Did JPN conduct any prior inquiry into the property type before issuing an identity card with a commercial address?

The statutory obligation to prevent irregular registrations does not rest solely on JPN. Under Regulation 13(2) of the Elections (Registration of Electors) Regulations 2002, the Election Commission (EC) has explicit investigative powers:

*“For the purpose of revising the supplementary electoral roll and of satisfying himself as to the qualification of any person for registration or determining whether the name of any person should be entered or retained... the Registrar may either make such house to house or other inquiry as he may deem necessary... or may send a notice requiring information to the person...”*

Given this clear statutory power, Tindak would like to know whether the EC exercised its investigative oversight to verify this entry. We have informed EC yesterday and the current

recourse for this suspicious movement is the action of the voter of the affected constituency.

### **3. Exercise your rights via Form D**

It must be noted that the Electoral Roll has already been certified and gazetted. Therefore, a formal objection can be lodged using [Form D](#) from 21<sup>st</sup> May 2026 to 19<sup>th</sup> June 2026. In light of this, Tindak urges existing voters in every constituency to remain highly vigilant and fully exercise their statutory right to object to any suspicious or non-compliant voter transfers into their constituencies.
